RESOLVED, that the compensation for the services of the Village Attorney and other attorneys associated with his law firm designated by him as Deputy Village Attorneys, for retainer legal services (all legal services required by the Village other than legal services in connection with litigation matters, or Village acquisition or sale of real estate) to be performed by the Village Attorney or under his direction, shall be \$250 per hour, plus reimbursement of all reasonable and necessary disbursements incurred in connection with the performance of such retainer legal services, which sums will be billed to the Village monthly by the Village Attorney or any law firm with which he may be associated, and it is further

RESOLVED, that the Board of Trustees hereby retains MEYER, SUOZZI, ENGLISH & KLEIN, P.C. as special counsel to the Village for non-retainer legal services as may be required, the services of such special counsel to be compensated at the rate of \$250 per hour, plus reimbursement of all reasonable and necessary disbursements incurred in connection with the performance of such non-retainer legal services, which sums shall be billed to the Village monthly.
